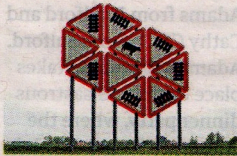


● SNAP: Art Inspired By Britten Snape

This year's SNAP, the contemporary art component of the Aldeburgh classical music festival (see p30 for classical preview), pays homage to the festival's founding father, Benjamin Britten, whose centenary is this year. The work produced by a lineup of 16 artists is certainly a testament to the composer's range.



Maggi Hambling's tight installation of paintings of battlefields and their victims are inspired by his War Requiem, while May Cornet's painted stone sculptures

reference his soundtrack to the classic Royal Mail public information film Night Mail. Others mine his lesser-known achievements, including pop conceptualist Scott King, whose musical score on a billboard alludes to the use of Britten's Playful Pizzicato in an RBS advert. **ss**
